Dear CCS Students,

As we approach the end of the 2019-20 school year, it is time to select courses for the 2020-21 school year. When selecting courses, it is important to make certain that each student is on track to complete all the requirements to graduate from CCS.

As you review the course selection sheet, you should reference the Course Description Guide, which will be attached to this email.

Students will select **ONE** course per period. In periods that offer trimester courses, students may select up to three courses. Students may select a maximum of **15 trimesters** of study hall over the course of their 4 years of high school at CCS, but students may not take more than 6 trimesters of study halls in any given year. Some exceptions may apply but must be approved by the Director of Student Life. Students may request to be aides (administration, teacher, guidance, etc.) or pursue work-study/ internships. Teachers are also willing to work with students through independent study courses in various disciplines.

- On the CCS high school website, you will find information about **online courses** that are available at an extra cost through various providers.
 - o Click on the link entitled *CCS Connects.* Students who choose to take an online course may have an additional study hall per trimester while they are taking the course.
 - Several of the online providers offer dual credit courses whereby students may earn both high school and college credits. CCS will accept a maximum of 4 credits from online providers or off campus classes (2 being core classes and 2 being non-core) that count towards the 27 CCS graduation credits.
 - Any student requesting to take an online or off campus course for credit must have approval from the Director of Student Life or the HS Principal. An online application form must be submitted for approval. Application forms can be requested from the Director of Student Life.

Please note that some courses are offered more than one period to provide some flexibility of choices in the schedule. Incoming ninth grade students should select the next level of math in sequence. If they were enrolled in Pre-algebra this year, they should select Algebra 1 or Basic Algebra for next year. If in Algebra 1 this year, they should select Geometry.

Ninth grade students are required to take and pass one trimester of the Research Skills course as well as one trimester of the Foundations of Health course.

Each student may plan a personal schedule of courses for grades 9 - 12 in cooperation with his/her parents and school personnel. College-bound students are urged to take at least three years of lab science and mathematics through Algebra 2 and at least two years of foreign language, to the extent that they can, without missing other valuable courses.

A minimum of 27 credits is required for graduation. The minimum number of credits in each discipline is listed below.
